Bill introduced by MLA Graydon passes in the Legislature

Bill 208 designates February 1 as Royal Canadian Mounted Police Day

Earlier today in the Manitoba Legislature, Bill 208, the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Day Act, passed third and final reading. Introduced by Cliff Graydon, MLA for Emerson, Bill 208 designates February 1 as Royal Canadian Mounted Police Day in the province of Manitoba.

“I am very pleased that Bill 208 has passed third reading today,” said Graydon. “The RCMP is part of the history of Manitoba dating back to 1873 when its predecessor, the North-West Mounted Police, was first based here. I was honoured to bring this bill forward to recognize that history, as well as the important role the RCMP plays in keeping our communities safe to this day. I look forward to celebrating the first Royal Canadian Mounted Police Day next February.”

Bill 208 will officially become law once it receives Royal Assent. February 1, 2017 will be the first Royal Canadian Mounted Police Day in Manitoba.
