<p>Comments:</p> <p>While students were off on winter break, Wab Kinew revealed that his NDP government will "probably" abandon the building of 9 new schools and 660 daycare spaces. As of mid January, the education minister offered no timeline for when planning will continue for the schools. These cuts will make classrooms more crowded, lessen resources for students, and eliminate childcare options for Manitoba families.</p>

In fact, all the NDP have done so far is cut out-of-province surgeries with NO plan in the interim, defund the international nurse recruitment program, and likely abandon 6 new personal care homes for seniors.</p>
